1 Peter 3:15-22: Christian stewards continue to do the right things for the right reasons because that is the good and godly thing to do. St. Peter reminds us that in so doing we will be blessed by God even if we are hassled by others.

PREDESTINATION—THE LUTHERAN DIFFERENCE

As Lutherans interact with other Christians, they often find themselves struggling to explain their beliefs and practices. Although many Lutherans have learned the "what" of the doctrines of the church, they do not always have a full scriptural foundation to share the "why." Because of insecurities about explaining particular doctrines or practices, some Lutherans may avoid opportunities to share what they have learned from Christ and His Word, including our understanding of prayer.

Our Lifelight Bible study group meets on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 a.m. in people's homes. Our study—Predestination: The Lutheran Difference—will identify how Lutherans differ from other Christians and demonstrate from the Bible why Lutherans differ on predestination, one of the most misunderstood doctrines of the church. PREPARING FOR DEATH

Preparing people for death (their own or a loved one’s), is among the most important work a pastor does. It is at the time of death when we each try to ask those “why” questions that may not have a satisfying answer and try to make sense out of what *does not make sense*. At such times our faith is tested the most. But properly prepared, it can be the time in which our Christian witness is the most effective, where we may have unique opportunities to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, who has defeated death and transformed it into the gate to eternal life. We might say, that if we are better prepared for our death, we are better prepared for life.

Over 400 years ago, a relatively unknown Lutheran pastor in Germany, Rev. Martin Möller, wrote a small book, *Heilige Sterbekunst*, which dealt with “the holy art of dying.” Although a book of this kind can never outgrow its usefulness, it was not available in English until Pastor Arthur E. Schulz translated it in 1974. We are examining this small book, *Preparing for Death* in our Sunday morning (10:30 a.m.) adult Bible study. We encourage all adults of the congregation to attend. Those who do, will find a very helpful companion and resource to use for many years in the future, as they face the death of their loved ones and their own inevitable death. *Preparing for Death* gets the message straight and gets the message of God’s love out. Please join us!

ASCENSION DAY SERVICE

Along with Easter and Pentecost, Ascension was one of the three most important festivals of the early church, but today it often goes relatively unnoticed. We continue to celebrate the Ascension of our Lord because it marks the highest degree of His exaltation. Seated at the right hand of God, Christ entered into the full use, according to His human nature, of the divine attributes He had set aside during His life on earth. We are comforted that our faith and hope rest secure in the ascended Christ who now is always and everywhere present and governs and protects His here on earth. We look forward expectantly to the day return when He will return in the same way He ascended. Please plan on joining us to worship on Thursday, May 5th at 7:30 p.m.
