OLD TESTAMENT LESSON: 1 Kings 17:7-16

Some time later the brook dried up because there had been no rain in the land.

Then the word of the LORD came to him: "Go at once to Zarephath of Sidon and stay there. I have commanded a widow in that place to supply you with food."

So he went to Zarephath. When he came to the town gate, a widow was there gathering sticks. He called to her and asked, "Would you bring me a little water in a jar so I may have a drink?" As she was going to get it, he called, "And bring me, please, a piece of bread."

"As surely as the LORD your God lives," she replied, "I don't have any bread—only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. I am gathering a few sticks to take home and make a meal for myself and my son, that we may eat it—and die."

Elijah said to her, "Don't be afraid. Go home and do as you have said. But first make a small cake of bread for me from what you have and bring it to me, and then make something for yourself and your son. For this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: 'The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry until the day the LORD gives rain on the land.'" She went away and did as Elijah had told her. So there was food every day for Elijah and for the woman and her family. For the jar of flour was not used up and the jug of oil did not run dry, in keeping with the word of the LORD spoken by Elijah.

Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. As it is written: “He has scattered abroad his gifts to the poor; his righteousness endures forever.”

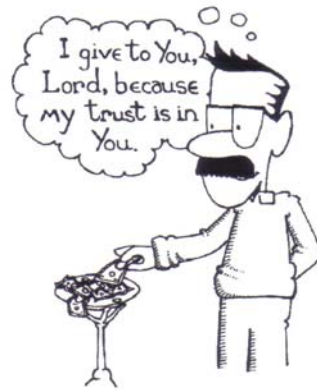

MAKING CHOICES THAT COUNT

The concept of tithing has been the method of financially supporting the Church and its ministry on earth since the early Church. If you do not already tithe, you are encouraged to participate in **Ten for Ten**, committing to give ten percent for ten weeks to our church. Though the prophet Malachi, God **challenges** us to: “*Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse; our response is to “test” Him and obey, and He will reward us by the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that [we] will not have room enough for it*” (Malachi 3:10). Even if at this time tithing is not possible, ask God for the faith and strength to grow in your giving.

PARKING DURING CONSTRUCTION

During construction, parking places near the church will be at a premium. Please leave the two handicapped parking spaces for those with state handicapped permits. 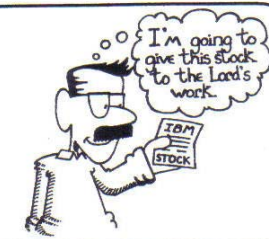

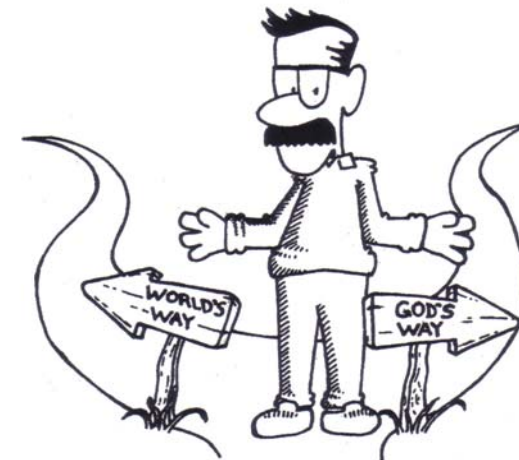
